


Groups file federal discrimination complaints over CT test, mask distribution

Disability advocacy organizations filed federal complaints Thursday stating the governor and state are not prioritizing those most at risk for COVID test and mask distributions.

Two Connecticut disability advocacy groups filed federal complaints against the state Thursday alleging violations of anti-discrimination laws regarding how at-home COVID tests and mask were distributed.

These groups said that Gov. Ned Lamont, the state of Connecticut and its Department of Public Health have violated federal anti-discrimination laws by not requiring towns and cities to prioritize giving COVID test kits and masks to people who are at higher risk due to health or living in congregate settings.

“The situation is urgent – it should not wait one day longer,” said Deborah Dorfman, executive director of disability Rights CT, in a statement. “DRCT’s clients and constituents with disabilities must be immediately provided with N95-masks and test kits and other COVID personal protective equipment. Delays in providing these items to individuals with disabilities receive reasonable modifications. Each day they are denied access to these items needlessly exacerbates the risk that they will become infected with COVID-19 and serves only to perpetuate disability discrimination.”

The complaints said Lamont has suggested prioritizing high risk individuals rather than requiring it, leading to 45 municipalities distributing test kits on a first-come, first-serve basis.

"There is a high risk that individuals with disabilities will not have access to them [test kits and masks] and thereby be discriminated against because of their disabilities," the complaints said.

The state hastily procured hundreds of thousands of at-home COVID-19 tests within the last week, distributing them to towns and cities. It was up to leaders in those towns to create independent plans to give the tests to residents. Along with the tests, Connecticut also provided towns with millions of N95 masks, distributed in a similar fashion.
